Member of Assembly 1878-1879. Represented the city as supervisor 1871-1875-1880. Died 1900.
OS-564 Sorge, Henry W.; Born in Germany, March 18, 1852. Came to the U.S. at the age of 16. He took up residence in Reedsburg Twp. In 1893. Mr. Sorge recognized an opportunity. He embarked in a modest way in the creamer business. His first venture was known as the Narrows Prairie Creamery, and this proved a success. Came to the city in 1902, and incorporated the Central Wisconsin Creamery. Became interested in

political and public affairs and soon was recognized as a man of executive ability. Was a member of the Wisconsin Legislature. In 1910 he was elected Mayor of the city, a capacity which he served 4 years. Died March 19, 1921.

- OS-565 Claridge, Thomas W.; Born in England Feb. 2, 1837. Received his education advantages in England. In 1856 he embarked upon a sailing vessel and set out for the U.S. Settled on a farm in Franklin Twp., Sauk Co. Moved to Reedsburg in 1882 and for a number of years was engaged in the real estate business. He was an honored veteran of the Union Army, and active in the Grand Army of the Republic. He represented the 2nd Ward as Alderman, and was one of the men who laid the foundation for Reedsburg's Municipal Ownership policy. Was appointed Post Master in 1903, and held that office for 5 years. Died April 2, 1922.
- OS-566 Hunt, Henry C.; Born in Mc Kean Co., Penn. July 27, 1840. Came to Reedsburg when a boy of 14, and received his education in the Reedsburg School. Mr. Hunt was identified with the commercial activities in the early days of the village. Served the State, Town, County, and Village in various offices of trust. Member of the Legislature. Held the office of Town Treasurer. County Superintendent. Member of the School Board. Grand Army of the Republic and Commander of the Post
- OS-567 Babb, James Wilson; Our most noted pioneer arrived here before Reedsburg was even a place. In the spring of 1844 this was just a lonely spot known to the few settlers in Wisconsin as "Indian Ford." Proceeding up the river he reached the fertile tract that comprised what became Babb's Prairie. From 1844 to 1851 "Babb's Ford" was the only river crossing we had. Mr. Babb was a great friend of the Indians, especially of Ah-ha-choker, the Chief of the Winnebagoes.
- OS-568 Ryan, Oscar R.; Born in Deering, N.H. Learned the Jewelry business in Baraboo. Came to Reedsburg in 1875, and opened a branch store. Commenced business for himself in 1878. A traveling salesman for several years. During the year 1880, Mr. Ryan was Treasurer of Sauk County Sunday School Association. Died Nov. 10, 1899.
- OS-569 Stone, John P.; Born in Oxford Co. on Feb. 5, 1847. Came to Reedsburg with his parents in 1856. Was successfully identified with the business of hop growing in the early days. On March 10, 1898 the State Bank of Reedsburg was opened for business with Mr. Stone as president. He guided the destinies of that financial institution with wisdom and discretion, and made it one of the strong Banks of Sauk County. Died July 1925.
- OS-570 Carver, Herman S.; Born in Cayuga Co. N.Y., Feb. 20, 1835. With his parents moved to Reedsburg in 1850. He was identified with the commercial activities of the then struggling village. In company with Mr. A.P. Ellenwood, engaged in the mercantile business for four or five years, after which moved to LaValle. Returned to Reedsburg in 1891, and engaged in the purchasing of R.R. ties for the Chicago & Northwestern R.R. Mr. Carver was keen to observe the humorous side of life. Died Dec. 28, 1919.
- OS-571 Finch, Mortimer; One of the early settlers in the village of Reedsburg. Many friends recall the genial kindly harness maker, and his wooden horse with its shining trappings. He had served his apprenticeship under the tutelage of August Ringling of Baraboo, father of the boys who later became world famous as owners of the Ringling Brothers Circus.
- OS-572 French, William Henry; Born at Holt in Wittshire England, January 29, 1836, and

- came to the U.S. in 1846. Began his life work at an early age in a woolen mill at Rockville, Conn. Moved to Reedsburg in 1886 to take charge of the Reedsburg Woolen Mills. Later he was a part owner and in 1896, retired. In the spring of 1896 was chosen mayor of the city and took an active part in the politics of the home town. A lover of music, and a member of the Reedsburg Male Quartet. Died 1915
- OS-573 Young, Moses; Born in Saratoga, N.Y. in 1822. Came to Reedsburg in the early days, and held a prominent place among the commercial interest of the community. Cashier of the Reedsburg Bank for one year in 1877. Later Superintendent of Sauk County Schools. Purchased the Sallade Pharmacy, and dealt successfully in hops.
- OS-574 Mackey, Dr. Ebenezer; Born in Broom Center Sohoarie Co. N.Y. Resident of Reedsburg from 1848? To 1860 when he moved to Catskill, N.Y. Dr. Mackey was the first druggist in the Village of Reedsburg, and built a hotel on Vine St. called the Mansion House. Died at the age of 84.
- OS-575 Henderson, Dr. Luther D.; Born in Antioch, IL, July 26, 1846. Came to Reedsburg with his parents in 1853. Bookkeeper in the old Mackey Bank 1870-1871. In 1881 bought interest in the Reedsburg Building and Lumber Co. In 1884 entered Chicago Dental College, graduated in 1887. Moved to Evanston, IL. Practiced his profession until he retired in 1919. Died July 24, 1921.
- OS-576 Kordenat, Dr. Carl; Born in Germany, Oct. 19, 1856. Came to America when 18 years old. Graduated from College of Pharmacy, N.Y. Mar. 22, 1881. Came to Reedsburg and opened a drug store and prepared himself for college. Graduated from College of Physicians of Chicago. Physician for Sauk Co. Poor Farm for several years. A member of Board of Directors Reedsburg Public Library. In the wide field of German and English Literature was perfectly at home.
- OS-577 Mackey, Joseph; 1822-1882; Pioneer of Reedsburg, able, trained businessman who handled vast problems in the early up-building of the city. He started the first bank, was instrumental in routing the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad through this territory. The Mackey Bros. Owned the water power, grist mill and saw mill in the early days. There are four Mackey's Additions to the City of Reedsburg.
- OS-578 Morse, Bell Ward (Mrs. George T. Morse); Only daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Ward, and like her mother, a generous benefactor to the Reedsburg Library. She donated the building site and later added many volumes and pictures from her own collection. She served on the Library Board and was deeply interested in its welfare and development.
- OS-579 Miles, Jennie; Connected with the post office department of Reedsburg for 22 years. During the administration of the following named Post Masters: Eugene Seaver, John Kellogg, H.C. Hunt, John Kellogg, Aug. Siefert, H.C. Hunt, F.W. Claridge. On death of John Kellogg, became active Post Master April 17, 1903 to June 30, 1903. Resigned on June 5, 1903. Died Oct. 1927.
- OS-580 Harris, Abner L.; Born 1830. His life was one of achievement. A successful merchant and produce buyer. It is said of him "Harris buys everything that crosses the bridge." Aggressive, yet an attractive personality, of broad vision, with the best interest of the city at heart. He sponsored and put over the installation of the water and light system single handed, in spite of tremendous opposition. With his daughter, Juliet, he traveled widely during his later years.
- OS-581 Ward, Mrs. Hiram P. (daughter of Mrs. Geo. T. Morse); Dubuque, IO was the home of Mr. & Mrs. Ward for 30 years. During their residence there, their home was

- recognized as the center of social, literary and musical life. For a number of years Mrs. Ward made her home at the National Capital. Mrs. Ward had always taken an interest in our Public Library and provided in her will that \$1,000 should be paid to the City of Reedsburg to be used for library purposes. Died at Washington D.C. March 28, 1911.
- OS-582 Wyse, Col. William A.; Born at Claremont, July 27, 1844. Came to Reedsburg in the early forties. Entered upon a course at the University of Wisconsin. When President Lincoln called for troops in 1861, Mr. Wyse then but a lad of 16, immediately left for the front. Enlisted in Co. K, First Wisconsin Infantry. The first student to offer his services to that struggle. Came to this city in 1872 and for 50 years Col. Wyse was identified with every movement in the progress of the city. Served the city in various offices of trust. Assessor, Supervisor, City Atty. and Mayor. Served H.A. Tator Post as Commander, head of the Military Co. for several years. Closely identified with Masonry for half of a century. Died July 21, 1921.
- OS-583 Mackey, Safford; Born at Rensselerville, N.Y. July 25, 1831; Came to Reedsburg in 1854. Probably no man in this section was more widely known in the early days of the village than "Saf" Mackey. Head of the saw mills at the time when the country was being cleared in the north woods, and the logs floated down the Baraboo River to the mill to be sawed into lumber. Interested in the water power and flour mill. Died Aug. 25, 1893.
- OS-584 Rood, Dr. Charles A.; Born at Packwaukee, WI April 14, 1852. Graduated from Rush Medical College in 1876. Came to Reedsburg in 1877. Dr. Rood held many responsible positions in his profession. He was surgeon for the C&N.W. R.R. for 14 years and for many years on the Pension Board. On April 8, 1904 the Dr. brought the first automobile to the city. One of the memories which will always live in the minds of those who knew him in his younger manhood, and of those associated with him is that of the Knight Templar Quartet composed of W.H. French, C.F. Shelden, Isaac Weaver and Dr. Rood. Died Nov. 20, 1920.
- OS-585 Mackey, Mrs. Cornelia; Born in Schocharie Co., N.Y. Came to Reedsburg in 1854. Mrs. Mackey was one of those who were identified with founding of our city. The lesson of frugality and simplicity in those early days ever remained with her. Died Aug. 30, 1921.
- OS-586 Markee, Asa E.; Born in Ohio, June 20, 1838. For a time he clerked for the firm of Harris & Hosler and then engaged in business on his own account which he continued until his retirement. For many years engaged in business in Reedsburg and the family have long been prominent in the city. Died July 13, 1916.
- OS-587 Harris, Mrs. Abner L.; Born in Oriskany Falls, N.Y. In early girlhood came to Reedsburg. Married Dec. 13, 1868. Mrs. Harris was identified with all interest which tended the uplifting of Church and society. President of the Ladies Aid of the Presbyterian Church for many years. Organization and founder of the Woman's Club.
- OS-588 Hunt, Mary J.
- OS-589 Stevens, Hon. Giles; His title "Cap" acquired in soldier days went with him through life. An able expounder of law. Probate Judge of Sauk County. Mr. Stevens was authority on Masonry and a member of all the Masonic Bodies, Grand Commander of the State. Prominent and loyal citizen of Reedsburg.
- OS-590 Stolte, Edward George; Born Dec. 1, 1867. Educated in Reedsburg and early in life became interested in the public welfare of Reedsburg which interest honest, and

intelligent and impartial made him known in every circle and as a leader in anything for public good. When 18 years old he entered employ of the C&NW Ry as baggage man. Four years later became manager of the Central House. In 1898 he and his brother, W.A. Stolte, purchased the Reedsburg Telephone Co. For several years he was a member of the School Board. Mr. Stolte was a man who was always busy, and yet had time for other duties and pleasure. It was the acts of kindly courtesy that made him a valuable friend and citizen. Died Dec. 1914.

OS-591 Riggert, William; Born in Germany, came to Reedsburg in early life. Identified with the business activities of the city for nearly half a century as a merchant, banker, public official. As a public official served his community in many capacities of honor and trust. Trustee of the Sauk County Farm for 27 years; a member of the board of education for 15 years; of the library board for 22 years; member of city council; connected with the Citizens Bank as cashier and president for several years. Died Oct. 3, 1921.
